## A Word from the Pastor

*Dearly Beloved,*

Greetings to you in the most precious name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

This year, our pastorate committee has decided to take up the building project to accommodate our Sunday school classrooms, a small hall for the assembly and meetings and offices and other necessary facilities. I am reminded of the scripture where Nehemiah was chosen by God to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem. Today, God has chosen us to be the builders so that the needs of our congregation and children are met. It is apt that our focus this month is going to be on the book of Nehemiah for our meditation. There are many problems to tackle. Finance is the biggest one of them all. But I thank God for a supportive congregation like you. Let us put this project in our daily prayers.

Let me share a few of my thoughts about Nehemiah, the great builder and reformer of Israel.

**Firstly**, the scripture says that Nehemiah was a great man of prayer. When he heard the plight of his people in Jerusalem, he wept and prayed in front of the Lord. He acknowledged that the

people of Israel had sinned against the Lord. They did not obey the Law of Moses. Captivity and exile was the punishment from God. At the same time, Nehemiah realizes that the Lord Yahweh is the most merciful and gracious God, if they repent and return to him and his commandments, though they are scattered all around the world, he would gather them together and bring them back to the Promised Land. Nehemiah pleads to God on behalf of his people.

**Secondly**, he was a humble servant and cup-bearer to the Persian King Artaxerxes, who enquires the cause of worry on the face of Nehemiah. Nehemiah explains the plight of his people and pleads for permission to go to Jerusalem and rebuild its walls. The King grants him not only the permission to go, but also appoints him as the new governor of Judah.

**Thirdly**, Nehemiah was a great leader and administrator. When he arrives in Jerusalem, he surveys the broken walls and to encounter the enemy's threat, he encourages all the people to build the broken walls of the city fallen in front of their homes. This was done so that they could be near to their home, protect their family

members and at the same time rebuild the walls of the city without any hindrance. The construction was completed in 52 days. Through his leadership, he protects his people, and teaches them the importance of family, unity and security through the rebuilt walls of the city.

**Fourthly**, he was a man of God. He dedicates the rebuilt gates, tower and walls of the city of Jerusalem to God. Through this act of dedication, he teaches them the lessons of repentance and obedience to God. They celebrate the feast of the dedication so that they could be ever grateful to God.

As we take up the building project, let us learn from Nehemiah. Let us be ever grateful to God for his providence. Let us learn to be obedient to him in whatever we do. When the call comes for His mission, let us do our best for the Lord. As Nehemiah showed his leadership and maturity in spite of adversities, let us learn to be patient and do God's will.

Please uphold and prayerfully support this project.

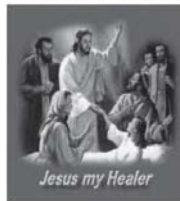

# Biography

## BARTHOLOMEW—THE APOSTLE TO ARMENIA

God sent two apostles to India; Thomas to South India and Bartholomew to North India, in the very first century to evangelize the entire India. Bartholomew literally means “son of Tlamai” [II Sam 3:3], who was the only one of noble birth, among the Apostles, descended from the king of Geshur, who had a daughter named Maacah and this Maach became the mother of Absolem. [II Sam 3:3]. Hence Bartholomew was of royal lineage. [St.Jerome]



Bartholomew is mentioned in all the synoptic Gospels and his name is entirely left out in the fourth Gospel [John]. It was Elias of Damascus, in the ninth century first pointed out that Bartholomew and Nathaniel are one and the same person. In all synoptic Gospels and Acts, the names of Philip and Bartholomew always occur together. In the fourth Gospel [John], we learn that it was Philip who brought Nathaniel to Jesus [John 1:45] and hence this conclusion.


When the persecution started around AD 35, majority of Apostles left Jerusalem and travelled westward or eastward, carrying the Good news with them. Bartholomew chose the eastern direction and he went as far as Armenia [ part of the then Iran and Soviet Union] and stayed initially for a brief period to evangelize that region. After sometime, he left Armenia and travelled southward and entered India and established several churches in the northern part of India. Eusebius declares in his “church History”, that about the time of accession of Commodus [AD 180], Pantanus, a leading teacher in the church at Alexandria, was sent as missionary as far as India and found the Gospel of St.Matthew, being used by the church members there. They all unanimously declared that it was brought by Bartholomew and he used it for teaching them. Bartholomew preached with much success that the heathen gods were rendered powerless.

He then left India and travelled to the north-west parts of Africa. He then returned to Jerusalem and travelled to Heiropolis in Phrygia, along with Philip, his closest companion. After the martyrdom of Philip, which resulted when he healed the wife of a Roman Proconsul and she became a Christian, he travelled to Armenia and met Judas Thaddaeus, who had already

commenced preaching and converting, during AD 43-66. Bartholomew joined Thaddaeus in AD 60 and planted several churches there. The shrines of Thaddaeus and Bartholomew still stand tall at Artaz [Macao] and Alpac [Bashkale] in south-east Armenia, and have always been venerated by the Armenians. Armenia church claims him as its founder. It is said that for 26 years that he wore a purple cloak and leather shoes, which were never worn out. He prayed hundred times a day and his voice always sounded like a trumpet.

While Bartholomew was in Albana [part of Armenia], he healed the King's daughter and exposed the emptiness of the King's idol. The King and many others were baptized, but the priests and the King's brother Astyages, remained hostile. They arrested Bartholomew, beat him and flayed alive and eventually crucified him in AD 68. What is our response to the 'Great Commission'?

## Your Question

### WHAT IS THE DANGER OF IDOL WORSHIP?

Idol worship has always been a transgression of God's law and abomination in the sight of God. God stated in **Ex 20:4-5** "You shall not make for yourself an idol in the form of anything in heaven above or on the earth beneath. You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I, the LORD your God, am a JEALOUS GOD.

After God declares that He is the only true God, He commands that He alone should be worshiped. God prohibits making idol or idolizing anything He has created anywhere or anything. Our worship must be governed by the power of faith. Not by the power of images or imaginations. The worship of God is to be spiritual not material. We must understand that God has always declared in His Word that He is far superior to anything that man builds with hands. During the time of the Old Testament prophets there were a considerable number of "popular" idols that the Israelites often very sadly chose to serve. There were Baal, Molech, Astarte and Ashera. The worshiping of these idols was often connected with drunkenness, fornication and divination (**Amos 2, Isaiah 2:6, Isaiah 3:2, I Kings 14:23**).

Even though we do not see today offering up sacrifices to Baal and Molech, there is still a modern danger in the realm of idolatry. There is also a danger in elevating anything above our love for Jesus. While idolatry in the Old Testament primarily deals with graven images of sticks and stones, there is another type of idolatry today. We read in **Ezekiel 14:3** "Son of man, these men have set up their idols in their heart, and put the stumbling block of their iniquity before their face: should I be enquired of at all by them?" In the New Testament we see that idolatry relates not only to worshiping carved images, but also it is the act of giving to any human desire precedence over God. Paul says in **Galatians 5:19-20** that "idolatry" is a work "of the flesh". Paul warns us in **Colossians 3:5**, 'Put to death, therefore, whatever belongs to your earthly nature: sexual immorality, impurity, lust, evil desires and greed, which is idolatry'.

So any human desire that holds precedence over God is idolatry. Every Christian should understand that anything can be an idol to us if we put it above God in our lives. Hence we are to be on guard against the danger of every form of idolatry because it tries to creep into every person's life. Worship only God and God alone, you will be blessed.

# THE STORY BEHIND THE PICTURE OF THE PRAYING HANDS

Back in the fifteenth century, in a tiny village near Nuremberg, lived a family with eighteen children. Eighteen! In order merely to keep food on the table for this mob, the father and head of the household, a goldsmith by profession, worked almost eighteen hours a day at his trade and any other paying chore he could find in the neighbourhood.



Despite their seemingly hopeless condition, two of the elder children, Albrecht and Albert, had a dream. They both wanted to pursue their talent for art, but they knew full well that their father would never be financially able to send either of them to Nuremberg to study at the Academy.

After many long discussions at night in their crowded bed, the two boys finally worked out a pact. They would toss a coin. The loser would go down into the nearby mines and, with his earnings, support his brother while he attended the academy. Then, when that brother who won the toss completed his studies, in four years, he would support the other brother at the academy, either with sales of his artwork or, if necessary, also by labouring in the mines.

They tossed a coin on a Sunday morning after church. Albrecht Durer won the toss and went off to Nuremberg. Albert went down into the dangerous mines and, for the next four years, financed his brother, whose work at the academy was almost an immediate sensation. Albrecht's etchings, his woodcuts, and his oils were far better than those of most of his professors, and by the time he graduated, he was beginning to earn considerable fees for his commissioned works.

When the young artist returned to his village, the Durer family held a festive dinner on their lawn to celebrate Albrecht's triumphant homecoming. After a long and memorable meal, punctuated with music and laughter, Albrecht rose from his honoured position at the head of the table to drink a toast to his beloved brother for the years of sacrifice that had enabled Albrecht to fulfil his ambition. His closing words were, "And now, Albert, blessed brother of mine, now it is your turn."

Now you can go to Nuremberg to pursue your dream, and I will take care of you.” All heads turned in eager expectation to the far end of the table where Albert sat, tears streaming down his pale face, shaking his lowered head from side to side while he sobbed and repeated, over and over, “No ..no ...no ..no.”

Finally, Albert rose and wiped the tears from his cheeks. He glanced down the long table at the faces he loved, and then, holding his hands close to his right cheek, he said softly, “No, brother. I cannot go to Nuremberg. It is too late for me. Look ... look what four years in the mines have done to my hands! The bones in every finger have been smashed at least once, and lately I have been suffering from arthritis so badly in my right hand that I cannot even hold a glass to return your toast, much less make delicate lines on parchment or canvas with a pen or a brush. No, brother ...for me it is too late.”

More than 450 years have passed. By now, Albrecht Durer’s hundreds of masterful portraits, pen and silver-point sketches, water colours, charcoals, woodcuts, and copper engravings hang in every great museum in the world, but the odds are great that you, like most people, are familiar with only one of Albrecht Durer’s works. More than merely being familiar with it, you very well may have a reproduction hanging in your home or office.

One day, to pay homage to Albert for all that he had sacrificed, Albrecht Durer painstakingly drew his brother’s abused hands with palms together and thin fingers stretched skyward. He called his powerful drawing simply “Hands,” but the entire world almost immediately opened their hearts to his great masterpiece and renamed his tribute of love “The Praying Hands.”

The next time you see a copy of that touching creation, take a second look. Let it be your reminder, that no one - no one - ever makes it alone!
